Current Environment









- Change of government and imminent first budget
- Threats of significant cuts to health budget and increased costs to consumers
- Possible changes to financing of health services and health insurance



Health Expenditure

- Health expenditure is rising \$140.2 billion in 2011-12
- Increasing out of pocket \$24 billion a year
- \$7 billion on dental mostly private
- Over 5 million prescriptions a week
- Mostly government (tax payer funded) 69.7 % of health expenditure.
- 39% of hospital work is primary care.
 Why isn't this being address in the primary care/community setting?











Costs for Consumers

PERCENTAGE OF AUSTRALIANS IN PAST YEAR WHO...











- did not visit a doctor	21%
- did not get a recommended test or treatment	33%
- did not fill prescription or skipped doses	22%
- did not see a dentist when needed to	43%
paid > \$1,000 for out-of-pocket costs	25%
waited > 4 months for elective surgery	
(amongst those needing it)	18%

Challenges for Health System

- Quality while maintaining affordability
- Safety and continuous improvement
- Appropriateness of services
- Access to services (right time, right place)
- Distribution of health workforce
- Greater proportion of population with chronic disease and requirements for long term and coordinated care
- Continued fragmented journey for patients transitioning across hospital, primary care, and aged care


