Our waistlines are getting bigger - how do we stop the great Australian bulge?

Australians are getting fatter. That's the hidden secret we prefer not to share on our Instagram food photos and our Facebook updates. Why is obesity so hard to talk about?

A 2017 Report from the Australian Institute of Health and Welfare: A picture of overweight and obesity in Australia, showed that nearly two thirds of adult Australians and one in four children are overweight or obese. And this weight problem is on the rise. We eat calorie rich food with little nutritional value because it is readily on hand, and we move about less than we should. Public health strategy focuses on reversing this trend. Those extra kilos costs us our health, our enjoyment of life and it costs the taxpayer.

Worryingly, the trend is impacting younger Australians, who are heavier at a younger age than the generation before them. This translates to health-related problems as they age.

Why is our spreading girth so hard to face up to? Fat shaming, bullying and poor mental health go hand in hand with excessive weight. The two are so

closely intertwined that poor mental health can lead to poor food choices and overweightness impacts self-esteem and wellbeing.

In 2018 the former Council of Australian Governments (COAG) Health Council, now the <u>Health Council</u>, committed to the National Obesity Strategy, a ten-year framework to reverse the trend and provide strategic oversite across various levels of government.

The national obesity strategy Working Group, drawn from Commonwealth, state and territory health departments leads this project, collecting and collating feedback on the draft strategy, resulting in a <u>proposed framework</u> and further ideas for discussion. Another round of consultation is invited. and CHF is preparing our response which is largely complimentary of the work. The sorts of things embedded in the framework cover; better food labelling requirements, reforms to food regulations and advertising standards, improved access to health advice including better training for health professionals, and affordable access to allied health professional services especially dieticians and exercise physiologists. There are infrastructure, urban planning and equity advancements that take the focus away from individuals and highlight systemic issues facing Australians today. CHF will reinforce our call for social prescribing and link workers in primary health to connect people with appropriate services. Further to the need for public health intervention to reduce health harms from obesity with education, support for health care professionals and regulatory framework, is the ongoing advocacy to improve health literacy in Australia. October is Health Literacy month, and we reflect on what health literacy is and how to go about improving outcomes for Australian populations. What's needed are achievable ways to target both vulnerable communities, and to support professionals delivering crucial health messages about preventative health and treatment. Work is underway in planning for CHF's advocacy strategy in the approaching Federal election, with consultations with consumers to prioritise up to five national policies we will be advancing with the government, opposition, minor parties and independents during the election campaign.

There are common themes running through these activities, the most obvious is that a fair and equitable health care system provides better care and better outcomes for all Australians.

- Students, studying or interested in public health. PHAA Members preferred, however not essential.


The total value of the scholarship will cover the cost of the virtual Conference registration.


